4 Exemplary

- Criteria in the Proficient category have been met.
- The response includes advanced work. For example, the material is not only informative, but also entertaining and engaging. Other examples of more advanced work include:
 - Student Presentation stimulated class discussion and inquiry
 - Students were engaged and active learners
 - Information presented contains a clear introduction and conclusion designed to capture the class's attention.

3 Proficient

- Material is logical and organized.
- Material has an obvious beginning, middle, and end.
- Key information is apparent, and the presenter supports conclusions with evidence.
- Information is appropriate for the audience.
- Material is delivered fluently, with good pronunciation and diction.
- Voices vary in volume, tone, and pacing.
- Eye contact is made frequently and correctly with audience.
- Posture and movements are not distracting.
- Gestures and demeanor are appropriate for material—before, during, and after the presentation.
- Presenter may appear a bit nervous, but nervousness is not distracting.
- Visual material is organized and informative

2 Progressing

- Eight or nine of the Proficient criteria are met.
- Additional work is needed. Lacks appropriate or complete material
- Information is repetitive and irrelevant
- No creativity
- Student failed to work at his or her expected level
- Information lacks critical thought and analysis

1 Not Meeting the Standard(s)

- Fewer than eight of the Proficient criteria are met.
- The presentation should be repeated after more practice and work.
- Lacks significant information and depth.
- Little or no outside effort
- Student failed to complete necessary information
- Historical information lacking in depth
